The EMHC (Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion) ministry, can trace it roots to the time of Jesus' birth. His mother Mary instituted this ministry. Mary - the first tabernacle, carried in her womb, the yet unborn child Jesus, as she visited her ageing first time pregnant cousin Elizabeth. We are told of the effect that this meeting with Mary had on Elizabeth, in scripture Luke 1:41, "the child in her womb leaped for joy". When we visit our homebound with Holy Communion, we too hope that their spirits are lifted and they rejoice at having made a contact with their Lord and Saviour. Pope Francis famously said that God's love for us, is only possibly outdone by His mercy for us. He has always stressed on understanding of God's mercy, and for us to imbibe fully the trait of mercy, in our lives. The EMHC ministry is a mercy ministry.... It is not as if those in the EMHC ministry, are special in any particular way. We all have our human limitations and each have our own short comings to overcome, and are completely aware of our insignificant existence.... But once again, Pope Francis beautifully reminds us, in his apostolic exhortation Gaudete et Exultate, written last year dated 19th March 2018 and published on 9th April 2018, that we are all called to holiness and to live meaningful Catholic lives. St. Teresa of Avila is quoted below

Christ has no body but yours.

No hands, no feet on earth but yours,

Yours are the eyes with which he looks

Compassion on this world,

Yours are the feet with which he walks to do good

Yours are the hands with which he blesses all the world.

This rings true, for everyone who is appointed as an EMHC. We feel compassion in our hearts, for our parishioners who yearn to receive Jesus in the Eucharist, and are unable to do so, because of old age or ailment. We walk carrying the Holy Eucharist to our parish homebound, most of whom live in buildings that are without an elevator and with well-worn staircases. This year, we were blessed with more hands and feet in the service of our Lord, when Mrs. Gracy Coutinho,

Mrs. Christina Franco, Mrs. Rosy D'Souza and Mr. Leonard Viegas, happily agreed to be part of this mercy ministry, and give their service to the parish. They were inducted into the ministry in mid-November 2019 by our Parish Priest Rev.Fr. Anthony F D'Souza.

Besides taking the Eucharist to the homebound, the parish EMHC's and Sisters of the Holy Cross also visit Bombay Hospital with Communion, as this hospital is within our parish boundaries. If you have a loved one in hospital or who is home bound in the parish, please inform your SCC animators and/or community co-ordinator to get in touch with us. We will be happy to visit them over the weekend with Holy Communion.
